GET EXCITED!

Patsy Weatherington, Vice President and chairman of the Program committee, has been working diligently with the members of the Shiloh #371 chapter in Savannah, and other West Tennessee chapters, to plan the most exciting events for our 2011 Sesquicentennial State Convention. The first thing I want to say, is please do not say, "we've never done this before," and get negative. Stay positive and excited about the wonderful plans being made on our behalf. Yes, there will be adjustments that must be made. Yes, there will be some committee meetings at different times to work around some special events. xBe flexible! Some

committees will need to meet on Thursday that usually meet on Friday. These times may be adjusted by the committee chairmen to occur either on Thursday morning or Thursday evening as necessary. There is no change in when prescribed meetings will take place. Friday night will still be "opening night," and Saturday will still be our business sessions. Shiloh #371 led by Mrs. Betty Stanley, is footing the bills for many of the once-in-a-lifetime opportunities we will be given. Joe Wheeler #1077, Elizabeth Bate Williams #1911, and George Wales Ellis #2263 are in charge of Friday night. Capt. Nathaniel A. Wesson #2396 is in charge of Saturday night. All of these chapters are working together to give us a convention to remember forever!

GET REGISTERED!

Because this convention is held at a Tennessee State Park, they have an early cut-off for rooms because they must fill them with tourists if we do not take them early. This should be a very busy summer for the Shiloh Battlefield park, and these are the closest accommodations to the park. Also, when you call to register you are charged for one nights lodging to reserve your room at the time you call, so be prepared for that. Phone: (731) 689-3135, tell them you are with UDC. Again, this is a protection for the State Park. We must be respectful of the citizens of Tennessee and the tourists who want to come here by registering early and keeping our commitments. We can be a part of keeping this State Park profitable and available. Do your part! A rough draft of the events includes:

THURSDAY, October 6, 2011

Committee meetings prior to noon, or in the evening, as necessary: Credentials

Committee, Finance Committee, New Business and Executive Committee Meeting.

At 1:00 P.M., busses will take members to Savannah where they will be given a tour of the River City Museum. A reception will be held at the Museum after the tour. Busses will be available to take members to any of the shops in Savannah (like the shoe store), and return them to Pickwick Landing State Park. Members will be on their own for supper, and may wish to eat while they are in Savannah. The Executive Board Meeting will be held on Thursday evening at Pickwick Landing State Park.

FRIDAY, October 7, 2011

Registration 9:00 A.M. to 2:00 P.M. will be available at the Pickwick Landing State Park. At 9:00 A.M., chartered tour busses will take members to the Shiloh Battlefield information center. We will have one of the final showings of the original Shiloh film on the busses while National Park Service Guides give us a tour of the battlefield monuments. We will go to the Catfish Hotel for lunch. Lunch will be family style with a serving of their three meat specialties, catfish, country ham, and chicken on each table.

After lunch we will travel to Shiloh Church where we will have our Memorial Service.

(Note: For those of you serving as Pages, there are rooms at the church where you may change for this service, and there is space on the busses to store your hats and clothing for the Memorial Service. We will not begin the service until the Pages are ready.)

Can you imagine anything more exciting than having our Memorial Service inside the Shiloh Church? What a wonderful and meaningful service this will be. Josephine Hill, our Division Chaplain and Matilda Speck, chairman of the Page Committee are working to make this a never-to-be-forgotten service. We will return to the Shiloh Business Office for a brief reception and to the Pickwick Landing Park at 4:30P.M.

All of the activities of these two days is estimated to cost around \$40 per member including the busses for two days, River City Museum tour, the Shiloh Battlefield Tour with movie and park ranger, and luncheon at Catfish House. All is included. If you only

attend one day's events, the cost will be the same because the charges are mainly for the bus and lunch on Friday. Everything possible is being done to offer this exciting time to all members who wish to participate. If anyone wishes to assist the Shiloh #371 with the bus expenses, please contact Patsy Weatherington, any help would be greatly appreciated.
